Good Afternoon everyone and welcome to The Energy Check County Ground for today's visit of Morecambe. I would like to extend a warm welcome to the Directors, management, staff, players and fans of our visitors today.





I don't know where to start following my last set of programme notes a couple of weeks ago given that so much has happened in such a short period of time. I would like to start though by personally thanking Matt Taylor for his time and huge efforts whilst in interim charge of the first-team. He impressed us all with his attitude and professionalism and I have no doubt that he will go on to become a top flight manager in years to come.

This brings me onto welcoming our new First-Team Manager Phil Brown and his Assistant Manager, Brian Horton to The Energy Check County Ground. Both Phil and Brian bring a wealth of knowledge and experience to the club following years of management at all levels of English football. This is something that is going to be hugely beneficial to us in the most crucial part of the season and it will hopefully give us

Fast forward a week to our trip to South West rivals Exeter
City who I still believe to be one of the best teams that I have seen here at The Energy
Check County Ground this season. This would prove to be a stern test for the team with Jayden Stockley proving to be more than a handful for the centre-back pairing, resulting in Exeter coming away 3-1 winners despite Kaiyne Woolery giving us an early lead following a twenty-minute period of dominance

from which positives can be taken moving forward.

Moving on to today's visit of Morecambe and Phil Brown's home debut, our visitors arrive here today having beaten Exeter City and drawn with Lincoln City within their last three games, which shows that today's game despite league position is going to be a very challenging one and the whole team are going to need to be switched on and well organised in order to achieve a much-needed three points.



SWINDON TOWN COMPLETED THE ADDITION OF FREE AGENT RYAN MCGIVERN ON A DEAL UNTIL THE END OF THE 2017/18 CAMPAIGN EARLIER THIS MONTH.

McGivern became new manager Phil Brown's first recruit and will add considerable experience to the back-line, bolstering the ranks following a series of injuries to the squad. 28-year old McGivern has over 200 senior appearances to his name and began his career with Manchester City. After six loan spells away from the Etihad, he made the temporary move to Hibernian a permanent one in May 2013.

The Northern Irishman, capped 25 times by his country, has since featured for Port Vale, Shrewsbury Town and Northampton Town

Morecambe will come into today's Good Friday clash lying 19th in the Sky Bet League Table, and they will be looking for a positive result to ease any relegation fears.


Jim Bentley has been at the helm since 2011 and he's carried out an admirable job on limited resources, building squads that contain both experience and youth. Bentley was a club legend at the Globe Arena during his playing days and he's highly thought of as a manager by the Shrimps' faithful too.

It has been an up and down season for the Shrimps who are unbeaten in their last four games with three draws and a win, a run that saw them take points off promotion hopefuls Exeter City and Lincoln City. This recent form has also helped to push Morecambe further up the table and away from the relegation zone as they once again look to secure their League Two status.

These two sides last did battle in August 2017 when a Donal McDermott wonder goal secured all three points for Town at a sun-kissed Globe Arena.

THE MANAGER JIM BENTLEY

Jim Bentley was given his first opportunity in football management when he succeeded Sammy McIlroy at the Globe Arena on the 13th May 2011, after being reserve team manager/first team coach since the previous July.

Bentley started out his career with Manchester City and spent 5 years with the then Maine Road club before leaving to join Telford United, a club where his father had become a legendary goalscorer (438 in 800) games over a career spanning 20 years. After a near five-year spell at the Bucks Head, Jim moved up to Christie Park in the summer of 2002, and embarked on a career that saw him make 329 appearances in all competitions with Morecambe, scoring 34 goals in the process.

He was for the main part of his time at the club captain, and there would have had no prouder moment than leading the team up to the Royal Box at Wembley to celebrate promotion to the Football League.

He has since brought many of the qualities to the management role that stood him in good stead during his playing career, and gives the same 100% commitment. He signed an extension to his contract to keep him at the Globe Arena until the end of the 2017/18 season in August.





BARRY ROCHE

Giant Dublin-born goalkeeper who joined Morecambe from Chesterfield in the close season of 2008. He has proved to be one of the club's best signings having won a handful of trophies at the club's Player of the Year Awards for the past few seasons. He has also recently passed the 400 appearance mark for the Shrimps. He signed a new one year deal in the summer and is still revelling in scoring his first career goal with a header to earn a 1-1 draw with Portsmouth in the 2015/16 season.

AARON MCGOWAN

The young defender who has risen through the ranks at the Globe Arena after being one of the first players on their EPPP scheme to join the ranks of the first-team. Aaron made his professional debut on 20 April 2013 in a 2–0 defeat against Torquay United, becoming the club's youngest ever debutant. In January 2016, he signed a new two-and-a-half-year contract to keep him at the club until July 2018.

ALEX KENYON

The battling midfielder, who signed a new contract in the summer, was with Everton as a youngster before he joined home town club Preston at the age of 16. He then joined the player development scheme at Myerscough College, plying his trade at Chorley. He then left Victory Park to join Lancaster City in 2009-10, where he became captain and his fine form saw him rack up a number of personal accolades.

His performances earned a move to Stockport County and his strong displays in the middle of the park were a rare highlight of 2012-13, and he ended up winning County's Player of the Season. After suffering relegation with County that season, he joined Morecambe in June 2013 and has since gone on to make more than 100 appearances where he has always impressed fans with his battling qualities.

STEVEN OLD --

Morecambe signed New Zealand defender Steven Old on a one-year deal in July 2017. He captained the New Zealand under-17 team in 2003 and made his All Whites debut a year later. He went on to play for New Zealand at the 2008 Olympic Games tournament in China and was part of the squad at the Confederations Cup finals in South Africa in 2009 - his last year as an All White. The 31-year-old has played in a number of countries including New Zealand, China and Scotland and was most recently playing in the Swedish second tier with GAIS.

GARRY THOMPSON

Morecambe re-signed veteran forward Garry Thompson on a one-year deal in the summer after his release by Wycombe. The 36-year-old started his career with the Shrimps and helped them win promotion to the Football League, scoring in their playoff final win over Exeter in 2007. After playing a big part in the Shrimps' first year as a Football League club, Thompson signed for Scunthorpe United on a three-year contract before a move to Bradford City where he helped Bradford to the League Cup Final and scored in a shock victory over Arsenal. He also helped the Bantams to seal promotion via a 3-0 play off victory over Northampton Town at Wembley, providing assists for both Nahki Wells and James Hanson.

ANDY FLEMING

Fleming, who signed a new one year deal in the summer, is now one of the Shrimps' longest serving players after joining from Wrexham in 2010. Fleming grabbed the attention of a host of scouts playing for Dean Saunders's side in the 2008–09 season and went on to make more than 60 appearances. He played two games for the England C side and caught the eye of a number of league clubs before opting for Morecambe when his contract at Wrexham ended. He made a stunning debut for the Shrimps in a 2–0 win over Coventry City in the Carling Cup, scoring both goals and he became the first player to score at Morecambe's new Globe Arena. He has now made more than 150 appearances for the Shrimps.

VADAINE OLIVER

Sheffield born Oliver began his career at his hometown club Sheffield Wednesday and penned a two year professional deal with the Owls. Following his release in 2012, the 23-year-old made an impact at Lincoln City where he netted 14 goals in 41 matches. His scoring exploits attracted interest from a number of Football League clubs and he duly signed for Crewe in June 2013 for an undisclosed fee. Whilst at Crewe had a loan spell with Mansfield Town before joining York in 2015 on a three year contract.

Following York's relegation from the Football League he had a spell on loan with Notts County and scored against the Shrimps last season. Returned to York and scored in their FA Trophy victory over Macclesfield at Wembley. He finished 2016–17 with 10 goals from 23 appearances for York as the club was relegated to the National League North after finishing in 21st place in the National League, before signing for Morecambe in the off-season.





ADAM CAMPBELL



The lively striker arrived at the Globe Arena in the summer after being released by Notts County. Campbell is a former Newcastle United player who played three times in a three year spell, including his first competitive debut against Atromitos in the UEFA Europa League to become the club's youngest player to play in Europe. He also played against Stoke City in the Premier League and helped Papiss Cisse score the winner in 2013. The quick and tricky wideman has represented his country at U 16s, 17s and 19s level and put pen to paper on a two-year deal with Morecambe in the off-season.





The experienced wide man is a firm fans' favourite at Morecambe with more than 300 Football League appearances under his belt. Ellison started his career in non-league football, playing for Southport, Chorley, Conwy United and Altrincham before joining Leicester City for £50,000 in 2001. He only played one game for the Foxes and moved to Stockport County and then Chester City before a £100,000 move to Hull City in January 2005. In 2006 he joined Tranmere Rovers for an undisclosed fee and a year later returned to Chester City, staying in the Football League with a move to Rotherham when City were relegated. Played more than 60 games for the Millers before joining the Shrimps to become Jim Bentley's first signing. He has nine goals so far this term.

MICHAEL ROSE



The former Town defender originally joined the Shrimps on a one-year deal in the summer of 2016 after being released by Rochdale and extended that contract in the summer. The former Manchester United trainee has played more than 450 league games for a number of clubs and he brings vital experience to the Shrimps' squad. Rose was an almost ever-present last season and was in the running for most of the player of the season awards and was appointed club captain in the summer.



11 PLAYERS WHO HAVE APPEARED JUST ONCE FOR SWINDON TOWN







DON TILLEY - played in Swindon's shock F.A.Cup defeat at Hastings in 1953



GEOFF CROOK

Geoff was given a trial at the County Ground in March 1960, after leaving the RAF. Small for a goalkeeper at just 5'9", he signed a pro contract in the July and was one of six stoppers to appear in the Combination side during 1960/61. Geoff's only first team outing came following an injury to Sam Burton in a drawn F.A.Cup First Round tie with Bath. Geoff came in for the replay at Twerton, where he conceded four goals but saw Town's strikers net six at the other end!




Born in Italy, Franco signed schoolboy forms at the County Ground in the summer of 1969 aged 14. He was drafted into the Second Division side at Blackpool in November 1973 following the sale of Rod Thomas to Derby, With Will Dixon and Joe Butler also available for the right-back role, any hopes of a recall Franco may have had were dashed when John McLaughlin was signed from Colchester—although he was named on the bench for the final game of the season.




DEAN CASSERLY

It was not so much as a one-game wonder for Dean - more a ten-minute one! Selected for Town's Associate Members Cup tie at Brentford in early January 1987, he was kicked in the face only four minutes into the game and after lengthy treatment was forced to leave the field with concussion. A first-year trainee at the time, Dean earned a pro contract a year later but was never given the chance of another first-team run-out.




DANNY BLANCHFLOWER

Early in February 1946, Town named a then unknown 19year old inside-forward from Belfast as a guest in the side to visit Reading. Robert Dennis Blanchflower had scored at Chelmsford on his debut for the reserves, but on his promotion to the first team he was unable to prevent Swindon from going down 0-5 at Elm Park. In April he returned to Glentoran - from where he would join Barnsley in 1949 on his way to a 500-game career with Aston Villa and Tottenham.



DAVID MURRAY

A native of Cape Town, David had impressed as a centre-forward while on tour in the UK with a South African XI in 1924. Signed by Everton a year later, he netted 13 goals in 44 games for Bristol Rovers prior to his arrival at the County Ground in June 1930. David appeared regularly for the reserves at full-back, inside-forward and centre-half-where he was given his one League outing, a 5-1 home victory over Northampton in April 1931.





MAURO ALMEIDA

Central defender Mauro - along with Ibon Arrieta and Franklin Anzite - was one of three players brought to the club in August 2007 by a Portuguese consortium and the potential new owners. Mauro played in a comfortable 4-1 home victory over Brentford in the League Trophy. Following a collapse in talks and the subsequent arrival of Andrew Fitton and his associates, all three were released. Mauro went to Ireland but then spent the remainder of his career in Angola.



ARNOLD BROADHEAD

The ultimate 'one-game wonder', Amold's name is in the Town's history books as the man with the best goals per game ratio in peace-time football - 2.0 - after hitting a second-half brace in a 4-1 Easter Monday victory over Gillingham in 1924. He had arrived on a free transfer a month earlier, having spent a month carrier, risking speric the 5'5" forward was soon on his way back there, taking a job as a bus conductor while playing for the company team Tillings FC.



REG JONES

Wroughton-born Reginald Warneford Jones was named after Rex Warneford, a naval pilot who downed a Zeppelin in 1915. Reg signed for Town in February 1936, netting a brace in his first two reserve games and a double-hat-trick in his third! By the end of April, he had grabbed 20 goals and earned the right to a Third South debut on the final day of the season - when he duly supplied the opener in a 3-2 home victory over Aldershot.



RAY BARLOW

During the last War, Ray was playing for local side Garrard Athletic before being signed by West Bromwich in June 1944. He went on to play almost 450 games for Albion but would in all probability have signed for Swindon had the club not been shut down by the government four years earlier. He did, however, get one chance to play for his hometown club, guesting for Town in October 1945 in a 4-2 victory at Bournemouth - where he netted two of the goals.



BRIAN DONALDSON

A wing-half given a trial by Bert Head after four unfruitful years at Stamford Bridge, Brian arrived at the County Ground ten days into the 1957/58 season. His one first-team opportunity came after an eight-game September schedule had taken its toll with seven on the injured list and another five suffering from a flu virus. Brian duly stepped up, playing out of position on the right-wing to help Town to a 2-1 home win over Southend and earn himself a contract.



HARRY AGOMBAR

After spells at both Arsenal and Tottenham while at school, Harry's career had been somewhat nomadic by the time Jed McCrory brought him to Swindon in July 2013. Injuries and the lack of any League competition for the reserve side during his two-year stay meant that very little was seen of Harry. He finally made an appearance in Town's last League game of the season against Leyton Orient in May 2015, but was withdrawn after an hour



ALF MORRIS, Swindon's first team trainer in December 1901, was called up to play at centre-half when the squad arrived at Kettering a man short - keeper Bob Menham having missed the train. Full-back 'Paddy' Fagan had to deputise in goal as Town crashed to a 10-1 defeat.

Just two days earlier, on Boxing Day, they had been forced to play a man short for the entire game at Portsmouth. This time it was winger Albie Edwards who failed to show - although he had notified the secretary of his non-availability.

Unfortunately, he did it by postcard which was delayed in the Christmas mail!





IN-DEPTH WITH...

Caffer, you have been here a couple of weeks ago now after being appointed, so how have you settled in so far and how have you found day-to-day life at the club?

I'm more than impressed with the running of the football club. We have an ambitious Chairman, we have a Chief Executive who has got good experience of running a football club from a business point of view and we have a Club Secretary who has a wealth of experience as well. I met a fair chunk of the supporters at the Sponsors' Dinner last week and I understood what they want from the team and I put that into the players. The ambition of the football club is to go to the next level and that's why they've brought me here, along with Brian Horton. It is the players I need to convince, everyone else seems convinced that we are going in the right direction and I've got to make sure that the players understand that. When they cross that white line I expect them to perform to the best of their abilities and I've had a great example of that against Cambridge, and I've had a not so good example of that defensively against Exeter.

Let's locus on those two games then, particularly the Exeter one, what would you say went wrong in Saturday's game?

The teams I have managed over the years would have come away from the Exeter game with a 2-2 draw. I'm not saying that happens all the time but when you win 3-1 away at Cambridge and everybody comes to the party, then you go 1-0 up against Exeter who are one of our challengers and we took our foot off the gas after scoring the goal. Consequently, we allowed a decent side into the game and they went in at half-time 2-1 up but if you look at the second-half it must have 65-35% possession if not more. Their only shot in the second-half came on their third goal and I thought if truth be told that the third goal flattered Exeter's performance. The moment came when the ball fell to Marc Richards after a quality cross from Chris Hussey and Marc pulled in at the back post like he has done his whole career and I expect that to burst the net. If it does burst





the net then we get the 2-2 draw and that is something I have to work on. The mentality of the group is that we either win it or we lose it, we win it or we lose it but if we're not playing well and we've got a foothold in the game then we still get something from it. They don't quite know me yet but that's going to be my message from now until the end of the season. One, a clean sheet mentality and two get a foothold in any game of football and get something from that game. It is part and parcel of someone's mentality to want to win, but I need this collective group to understand that. Without a shadow of a doubt we are a good enough team when we have the ball, but what I need to work on is the mentality of the group when we don't have the ball and if we crack that between now and the end of the season I'll take whatever comes.

As a manager you have come up against Swindon many times so when you got the call from the Chairman, just how excited were you to take this opportunity?

I was excited by a couple of things, the size of the club and the ambition of the Chairman and I think the potential here is untapped and I want to fill this place - that is my ambition. I've been on the end of it when it has been rocking and that is what we need, we need that whole collective belief and we need everyone on the same hymn sheet. If we get that in such a short space of time then I think the challenge is mouthwatering. You very rarely get a job where a team is at the top end of a division and fighting for promotion, you normally get a team that is at the bottom with a losing mentality. We haven't got that here but I need that winning mentality back.

We have Morecambe and Crawley coming up just days apart so just how crucial is this Easter period?

After the Easter period I think we'll have a really strong idea of what is going to happen between now and the end of the season,

both with performances and with results. If we dare to dream to get six points over this weekend then anything is possible, but there is a lot of hard work to be done both on and off the field of play. I don't normally start working on a game-plan on a Monday for Saturday because I'm putting to bed the previous game, but this weekend demands that and Jim Bentley is going to bring a mentality to this stadium to hurt us, to take from us, to be horrible against us and we have to actually stand up against that and bring the quality that we've got in abundance to the party.

The one thing you have stressed in your short time here is to take one game at a time but, with two games within a couple of days of each other, how easy is it to stick to that sentiment?

The holiday periods throughout our campaign are always going to be important times. You can always guarantee that there are going to be back-to-back games over Easter and they normally define your season. I want this definition of our season to be a positive one but, at the same time, it is time for the family too and I'm hoping that families will turn out in their hordes to get behind the team being my first home game. It will be nice to see a swelled crowd and some extra noise and support to get behind the boys because that is what we need.

You will obviously be focussed on events on the pitch today but it is your first home game in charge, so just how excited are you about the occasion?

It is an interesting question borne out of the fact that I've now managed six clubs and had six debuts as a manager, but after back-to-back away games I was hoping to be able to bring four, maybe six points back here so that it would guarantee a swelled crowd. I know there are one or two fans who were disappointed to have travelled all the way down to Exeter to see a defeat and rightly so, but I would say they were more disappointed with the scoreline rather than the performance. The bottom line is that, it being my first home game, I want as many supporters as possible through the turnstiles to make it a more mouthwatering experience for me and for the players as well. Pressure is important and getting the right amount of feeling from that pressure is a motivator for me and the bigger the crowd the better I am.

You've had a very warm welcome here so that must be nice to be made to feel so welcome so early on in your Swindon career?

The welcome I've had here has been very, very nice and I've been made to feel very welcome. The Chief Executive, the Club Secretary, the





people at my hotel and the people in and around the town have all been great. I'm not one for shying away and hiding behind a closed door, I like to get out and about in the town and get a feel for it because, at the end of the day, I was a supporter when I was a little boy a Sunderland and if I'm sending the supporters home with a smile on their faces then I've done my job. That's what I want to do today.

In any walk of life to be successful you need to surround yourself with positive people with Brian Horton and Matty Taylor, so tell us about your relationship with those two...

I've always, whenever I've taken over, looked at the staff first and foremost to see what is good about them and to see what they can do, and the staff here are young, a little bit naive at times but very, very enthusiastic and the support they have given me so far has been first class, none more so than Matty. He must have been bitterly disappointed to have been beaten in his first game in charge but I've worked with him for a couple of weeks now and I haven't stopped asking him questions, neither has Brian. We know that his DNA was on the team, his DNA is certainly in the changing room and I would have been a foolish man not to have utilised that. His quality as a player is still there in abundance and he has conducted himself throughout his life in the right way and he wants to win. He spoke a lot of home truths after the Exeter game and pointed the finger at one or two players and I don't mind that, confrontation in the changing room either ends up in you fighting against each other or ends up in you fighting with each other

out there, and I need to get them to fight with each other outside and the opposition will feel the wrath of that. Matty has been priceless and Brian has been my number two now for over ten years. His support is invaluable, his experience is invaluable, the advice he gives me is invaluable and I would be foolish not to draw upon that, so I've got the youthful exuberance of Matty Taylor and the elder statesman in Brian and I'm hopefully somewhere in the middle learning from the both of them.

Final question, Morecambe are the visitors today in what is a huge game so what should we expect from a lim Bentley side:

The year we got promoted at Southend we won nine games on the bounce at the end of the season to put us into third place heading into the final day. Jim Bentley had nothing to play for but there is not a chance that his side were going to lie down. His teams are always well versed, well prepared and I saw him at the Exeter v Yeovil game two weeks ago, he was there with his assistant and they had driven all the way down from Morecambe to see Exeter play and then they beat them on the Tuesday. He's a clever man, he's a very funny man too but it is never fun when you are playing against his teams because they are tough. That day they beat us he made no apologies for it, he was playing for the points and that put us into the Play-Offs. Jim was a thorn in our side and these are the tests of character that we've got to stand up to. We've got to go toe-to-toe with Morecambe and I'll be picking the players that I think can stand up to the physical side of the game and hopefully then we can bring our quality to the table and win the game.

From the M25 take the M23 Southbound towards Gatwick Airport and Brighton. At the end of the M23, before it becomes the A23, leave the motorway at the last exit at Junction 11. At the roundabout at the end of the motorway slip road, turn right onto the A23 towards Crawley and the ground is down on the left just before the next roundabout.

The car park at the stadium costs £5 and there is also a free to park area at Broadfield Park, which is accessible from the A23 as you come down the hill from the motorway. There is also street parking available.

BY TRAIN

Crawley Railway Station is just over a mile away from Broadfield Stadium. You can either take a taxi which costs about £6 or jump on a Fastway number 10 bus to the ground from the bus station across the road. Should you wish to walk from the station then turn a left as you come out and walk down to the T-Junction, before turning left into Brighton Road. Keep walking straight down Brighton Road for just under a mile and at its end turn right, where you should be able to see the stadium in the distance. Use the underpass to cross the A23 to get to the ground.



PUBS

There is a bar at the stadium at the back of the Bruce Winfield Stand called the 'Redz Bar', which allows in away fans. Entrance to this bar is gained from outside the stadium. Alternatively, the New Moon pub and the The Downsman are both located a short walk away from the stadium.
