The Cumbrians will arrive at The Energy Check County Ground this afternoon desperate for three points in order to keep their Play-Off hopes alive with the Sky Bet League Two season rapidly drawing to a close.

Carlisle have once again been competitive under Keith Curle, showing no signs of a hangover despite losing out in the Play-Off Semi-Finals to Exeter City last term following a thrilling twolegged affair. Having challenged at the top end of this division for a couple of years now, United will be hell-bent on going one step further and finally securing that elusive promotion. Despite the loss of key man Nicky Adams to a season-ending injury, Carlisle still boast plenty of quality in the dressing room, including leading scorer Hallam Hope who has hit eleven goals so far this term. The likes of Jamie Devitt, Danny Grainger, Richard Bennett and Reggie Lambe have also chipped in with goals this season and this Cumbrians side are a match for anyone on their day.

These two sides last met on the opening day of the 2017/18 season when goals from Luke Norris and Paul Mullin gave Town a 2-1 victory at Brunton Park in August 2017.

THE MANAGER

Carlisle United appointed Keith Curle as their new First-Team Manager until the end of the 2015/16 season in September 2014.

Curle, 54, made over 700 appearances in a senior career which spanned over 24 years for the likes of Wimbledon, Manchester City, Wolves and Sheffield United.

He started his managerial career as player-manager with Mansfield Town and has also held the reins at Chester City, Torquay United and Notts County.

A distinct improvement in performances and results led to Curle signing a new deal with the club in February 2016 which will him at the club until the summer of 2018.

Curle led United to the Sky Bet League Two Play-Offs last season, where they were defeated 6-5 on aggregate by Exeter City over two pulsating Semi-Final Legs.

Carlisle have showed no signs of a hangover this season, however, and they still have a chance of once again making the Play-Offs with Curle overseeing improvement season upon season at Brunton Park.

PLAYER PROFILES





JACK BONHAM

The keeper joined United on a six-month loan deal from Brentford during the summer transfer window. He made the number one spot his own and signed a second six-month deal during the January window. He came through the youth ranks with Watford and went on to make one appearance for his first club, in the final game of the 2012/13 season against Leeds United. He enjoyed a two-month loan spell with Harrow Borough during his time with the Hornets, making nine appearances until a broken hand forced his return to his parent club. He joined Brentford on a two-year permanent contract in the summer of 2013 and signed a further three-and-a-half year deal in January 2015 having impressed with his attitude and application. A two-month loan spell with Arlesey Town in November 2014 brought 15 appearances and he also represented the Republic of Ireland U17 side during his younger days at Watford. He has recently penned a fresh deal with his parent club.



DANNY GRAINGER

The experienced left-back became the first summer signing of 2014 when he returned to his native Cumbria to join the club on a one-year deal. His attitude and approach earned him a succession of new deals which will keep him at Brunton Park until the summer of 2018. Grainger had played exclusively north of the border since turning professional but spent his formative years with the Blues as part of the Centre of Excellence programme. The Penrith-born defender has enjoyed spells with Gretna, Brechin (loan), Dundee United, St Johnstone, Hearts and St Mirren during his 12-year stay in Scotland and had a short trial period at Brunton Park in pre-season in 2013 before joining Dunfermline. Grainger is the current Carlisle United Club Captain.



GARY LIDDLE

United signed the experienced Liddle on an 18-month deal at the start of the January 2017 transfer window. Liddle was also a target for Carlisle boss Keith Curle during the January 2016 transfer window. The versatile centre back, who can also play on both flanks of the back-four and across the midfield, started his career with the Middlesbrough Academy and earned a professional contract when he broke through the youth ranks. He moved to Hartlepool in 2006 and made over 250 appearances in his six-year stay, bagging 21 goals along the way. Curle took him to Notts County in 2012 and he played every minute of his first campaign with the club, equalling a long-standing club record. Bradford City was his next stop in the summer of 2014 and he joined Chesterfield on Transfer Deadline Day last year, where he made 46 appearances and scored once before making the switch across to Cumbria.

CLINT HILL - -

Carlisle signed the vastly experienced defender on a shortterm deal at the end of September 2017, before it was extended until the end of the campaign. Hill started his career as a youngster with Tranmere Rovers and went on to make over 150 appearances at Prenton Park. Oldham Athletic snapped him up for a reported £250,000 fee in 2002 but a broken leg ended his season with the Latics just before Christmas that year. A move to Championship outfit Stoke City followed and he spent five years at the Britannia Stadium where he battled his way into the side having recovered from an anterior cruciate ligament injury. Neil Warnock swooped to capture his signature for Crystal Palace in January 2008 and he helped the Eagles to a Championship Play-Off place at the end of that season. He followed Warnock to Queens Park Rangers in the summer of 2010 and became a favourite at Loftus Road as he notched up over 200 appearances. He was handed the captain's armband when Harry Redknapp took over the reins in 2013. The big defender spent last season with Scottish Premier League giants Rangers and achieved hero status when he bagged a late equaliser in the March 2017 1-1 Old Firm draw with Celtic.





LUKE JOYCE

Midfielder Luke Joyce returned to Brunton Park during the summer of 2015 on a two-year deal. Joyce kicked off his senior career when he joined United from Wigan on a youth loan at the end of the 2005/06 campaign. The deal was made permanent that summer and he went on to make 28 appearances and score three goals during his three-year stay with the Cumbrians. Loan spells with Barrow and Northwich Victoria towards the end of his spell caught the eye of Accrington Stanley and he went on to become Club Captain and a near ever-present as he notched up over 275 appearances in the midfield playmaker role. Has made over 30 appearances so far this term for United.

MIKE JONES

The hard-hitting midfielder signed for Carlisle on a two-year deal last summer which keeps him at Brunton Park until at least the summer of 2018. Jones came through the ranks at his hometown club of Tranmere and signed a professional contract with them in 2006. A loan spell with Shrewsbury preceded a permanent move to Bury where he made over 150 appearances in just over three-and-a-half years. He signed for Sheffield Wednesday in the January 2012 transfer window and made the move south to Crawley in August that year for a very successful two-year stay. He joined the Latics in June 2014 and scored ten goals in his 86 appearances. He has been an ever-present in the engine room this season.

OUR VISITORS

JAMIE DEVITT

Wide man Jamie Devitt signed on a two-year deal in June 2016 which keeps him at Brunton Park until at least the summer of 2018. Dublin-born Devitt started his career at newly promoted Premier League side Hull City and was voted their Young Player of the Year for the 2007/08 season. In 2011 Devitt was capped by the Republic of Ireland U21 side. He went on to have seven loan spells before signing for Chesterfield in the summer of 2013. His time with the Spireites resulted in eight appearances before he joined Morecambe, initially on loan. Jim Bentley made the move permanent in the summer of 2014 and Devitt made 98 appearances for the Shrimps, scoring 12 goals before making the switch to Carlisle.

JAMAL CAMPBELL-RYCE

Experienced winger Jamal Campbell-Ryce joined United on a half-season contract during the January transfer window. The nippy winger was most recently with Barnet and scored five goals in 58 appearances during an 18-month stay with the Bees. Lambeth-born Campbell Ryce started his career with Charlton and had loan spells with Leyton Orient, Wimbledon and Chesterfield during his three-year stay at The Valley. He joined Rotherham on a free transfer in November 2004, then moved to Southend in the summer 2006 via a loan stay with Colchester United. A three-year stint with Barnsley followed, where he scored 13 goals in just over 100 appearances, and that prompted a January 2010 transfer window move to Bristol City where he went on to play 65 games. His career path then took him to Notts County, Chesterfield, Leyton Orient and Sheffield United before he moved back to London and the New Hive in August 2016. Campbell-Ryce made 18 appearances for Jamaica and featured in World Cup qualifying campaigns for the Reggae Boyz.

REGGIE LAMBE

United clinched the signature of Bermudan international Reggie Lambe on a two-year deal in June 2016 which keeps him at Brunton Park until at least the summer of 2018. Lambe cut his teeth in the game in the youth ranks at Ipswich and made six appearances whilst at Portman Road. He enjoyed a loan spell with Bristol Rovers, prior to a move to Canada to play with Toronto FC in the MLS, where he became a Championship winner in 2012. A three-month move to Sweden's Nykopings BIS followed where he played 12 games and earned himself a trial with Mansfield Town on a two-year deal. He made his debut for the Stags in their 3-2 home victory over Carlisle United in September 2014 where he came on as a 74th minute substitute for Fergus Bell.

HALLAM HOPE

United manager Keith Curle finally got his man during the summer 2017 transfer window when he captured striker Hallam Hope on a two-year deal. Hope has already spent time with the Blues when he initially joined United on a one-month loan deal at the end of October 2015. He bagged the goal which sealed the win in the FA Cup First Round away victory against Plymouth during that spell and extended his stay with the club until the end of that campaign having recovered from a troublesome ankle injury. His half-season stay with Carlisle netted him five goals in 25 appearances. Hope started his career when he moved to Everton from Manchester City as a youngster and had loan spells with Northampton, Sheffield Wednesday and Bury (twice) whilst still with the Toffees. His move to Bury became permanent when he signed a three-and-a-half year deal with the Shakers in January 2015. He has represented England at U16, U17, U18 and U19 levels.

SCOTT ENDERSBY

Scott was signed by Ken Beamish as cover for Jimmy Allan just a fortnight before the 1983/84 season kicked off. And it proved a timely acquisition as the experienced Scot suffered a badly broken arm in early October. Londoner Scott became a County Ground favourite, winning player of the year in 1984/85. But he then lost his place to Jake Findlay and a contractual dispute led to him refusing to play. He joined Carlisle after a loan spell there. STFC 100 apps / CUFC 59

GARY FULLBROOK

After spells with both Bristol City and Southampton while at school, Gary gained an apprenticeship with Town in July 1982. His initial taste of first team football was brief - just a few minutes as a substitute in a goalless draw with Scunthorpe in November 1984. Gary's only other appearance was a full 120 minutes in the home FA.Cup defeat by Dagenham. Former Town assistant-manager Harry Gregg took him to Carlisle in September 1985. STFC 2 apps / CUFC 10





GRANT SMITH

Signed in July 2003, Grant spent most of his first year at the County Ground on the bench on 32 occasions to be exact - and was handed just four starts. But after scoring twice in as many minutes in a win at Bradford early in 2005, he was finally given a run by Andy King - and responded with a further seven goals in twenty games. Following a spell in Finland Grant signed for Carlisle in January 2008, spending 15 months at Brunton Park. STFC 50 apps / CUFC 21



PAUL THIRLWELL

Paul was the second of seven players loaned by Town during a wretched 1999/2000 season, arriving in September after making a handful of appearances for Sunderland. He stayed at the County Ground for two months before returning to Wearside to make his Premiership debut in the December. TROY ARCHIBALD-HENVILLE

A Londoner who had come through the ranks at Tottenham, Troy arrived at the County Ground from Exeter in July 2012, a tribunal setting the fee at £200,000. But injuries prevented Town from seeing much of him and after only six starts he was loaned to Carlisle at the start of 2013/14. A recurrence of a knee problem soon saw him return south and he managed a further 15 games for the Reds before signing a permanent deal at Brunton Park. STFC 23 apps / CUFC 41



BERTIE LYON

A Yorkshireman, Bertie spent two seasons (1905/06 and 1907/08) at the County Ground and 1906/07 at Carlisle. In the days when few players were comfortable in more than one position he filled five for Town - and he had previously played in goal during a Second Division game for Leicester, keeping a clean sheet 1 Bertie was top scorer with 14 in his first season in the south but netted just one thereafter, against Bradford Park Avenue in March 1908, STFC 69 apps

DON McPHAIL

Hamilton-born winger Don was given a pro contract by Dumbarton but it was annulled by the Scottish F.A. because he was under age ! After starting 1933/34 with Barnsley, he joined their Third Division North rivals Carlisle in the December. Spells with Nuneaton and Burton Town followed before Don was signed by Swindon's Ted Vizard in March 1936. He left in the summer of 1937 and in July 1950 became Burton Albion's first manager. STFC 22 apps / CUFC 5



FRANK LARGE

The sale of Bobby Woodruff to Wolves in March 1964, opened the door for Town to invest a reported £10,000 in a striker who had hit 85 goals in under 200 League games. Frank promptly netted twice on his debut against Plymouth but hit only two more before joining Carlisle at the end of September. His 16 goals made him second top scorer at Brunton Park as United won the Third Division title to swap places with relegated Swindon. STFC 17 apps / CUFC 52



LEE PEACOCK

Lee served five managers in the four years he spent as a player at the County Ground and was joint top League scorer as Town were promoted from the bottom tier in 2007. Previously, both Manchester City and Bristol City had paid half a million pounds to secure his signature. Lee's League career had started at Carlisle where, at 17, his debut carne against Wigan in April 1994 - on the same day that relegation from the Premiership was confirmed for Swindon. STFC 138 apps / CUFC 96





JON-PAUL McGOVERN

Signed by Paul Sturrock from MK Dons in August 2007 on a three-year contract, JP' ended up staying four. In 2009/10 - when Town narrowly missed out on promotion from the third tier + he made S5 appearances, providing numerous assists for Billy Paynter and Charlie Austin. Following Town's relegation in 2011, JP remained in League One by Joining Carlisle, missing just one game as they finished eighth. STFC 177 apps / CUFC 94



JOHN GORMAN

A former Celtic reserve left-back, John signed for Carlisle in September 1970 and went on to make over 270 apps in his six years at Brunton Park. He helped them gain promotion to the top flight in 1974, but they came back down after one season. But John moved back up to the old First Division in November 1976, signing for Tottenham - but his time at White Hart Lane was interrupted by a bad knee injury which kept him out for 17 months.

From 1970 to 1974, John played in seven of the eight meetings between Carlisle and Swindon, four of which ended in draws with Town winning just once.

IN-DEPTH WITH...

Stuart, let's start with the Easter weekend which saw us collect two points from two games. What were your thoughts on those fixtures overall?

They were both difficult games for different reasons. We were disappointed not to take more from the games but you look at the positives in terms of how we played and I thought we were unlucky not to take more from the games. Looking forward, you can tell that there is a lot more belief and we feel a lot more solid as a unit under the manager. Overall, apart from not getting the wins I was happy with how we played.

BY ROAD

Leave the M4 at Junction 26 and take the A4051 towards Newport. After going under a flyover on the A4042, you will reach a large roundabout where you take the second exit keeping in the filter lane towards the City Centre/ Railway Station. At the next roundabout take the first exit going across the river onto the B4591 towards Maindee. At the traffic lights bear right onto Chepstow Road and then take the first right into Corporation Road. Take the next right into Grafton Road and the entrance to the ground is down on the left.

PARKING

There is no parking available for fans in the main club car park, although you will be able to find street parking around the ground. City centre car parks are located 15-minutes walk away.

BY TRAIN Newport Railway Station

is situated around a quarter of a mile away from the stadium and is a short walk. The station is served by trains from London Paddington, Bristol Temple Meads and Birmingham New Street. As you come out of the main station entrance turn left along the main road. Follow this road until you reach a large roundabout, then take the pedestrian underpass down underneath the roundabout and at the centre turn left towards Clarence Place/River Usk. After you have come back up to street level you should see a bridge in front of you going across the river. Cross the bridge and then take the first right-hand turn into Rodney Parade and the stadium is down this road on the left.



PUBS

There is a clubhouse at the ground which does admit away fans. Alternatively, there is the Excelsior Club on Corportation Road and a Wetherspoons called the Godfrey Morgan on Chepstow Road.
