THE MANAGER JOHN COLEMAN

John Coleman returned to Accrington Stanley for his second spell as manager in September 2014 following a spell away from the club.

Coleman's first spell at Accrington Stanley saw him become the club's most successful and long serving manager as he returned the Reds to the Football League by winning the Conference title.

The prolific non-league goalscorer joined the club as player/manager after a successful spell at Ashton United in 1999, leading Stanley to the Unibond First Division title at the first time of asking.

The Premier Division title, numerous cups and ultimately promotion to the Football League followed in 2006. Each season in League Two he improved the club's finish, culminating in a highest position since the 1950's of fifth in 2011 followed by a play-off semi-final defeat to Stevenage.

He left the club to join Rochdale in 2012 but after a year at Spotland and spells with Southport and Sligo Rovers he returned as Stanley manager in September 2014.

In his first full season back with the Reds he led the side to the brink of promotion, claiming a fourth placed finish in League Two before losing out to AFC Wimbledon in the play-offs.

The Reds finished 13th in the 2016/17 season after a 15-game unbeaten run and the start of 2017 took them from the relegation battle towards the promotion places.

And Coleman has led Stanley to even greater heights this season with the club sweeping all before them to storm to the Sky Bet League Two Title in emphatic fashion.

PLAYER PROFILES





AARON CHAPMAN

Chapman is now in a second spell with Stanley after an earlier loan period was curtailed by a serious injury. He returned in the summer of 2016 having been released by Chesterfield. Chapman began in non-league football with Belper and soon drew attention from league clubs, ultimately moving to the Proact Stadium before joining the Reds on loan. The 6 foot 8 custodian is now in his second full season with the Reds.



JIMMY DUNNE

Irish central defender, Jimmy Dunne, joined Stanley on loan from Burnley in January 2018, and made his Football League debut two days later as a second-half substitute in a 4-0 win over Chesterfield. Dunne was on the books at Manchester United as a youngster, before signing professional terms at Turf Moor. He spent the early part of 2017/18 on loan at National League side Barrow, making 21 appearances and scoring two goals, before moving to the Reds for his first taste of the EFL.

MARK HUGHES

Hughes had a brief loan spell at Stanley in 2013 and returned in January 2016 on a permanent deal after leaving Stevenage. The former Everton trainee has well over 200 appearances at Football League level under his belt and also had a spell playing in Australia. He's well known to manager John Coleman and assistant Jimmy Bell having grown up in the same part of Merseyside as the pair. Hughes signed a contract extension in July 2017 to keep him at the club until 2019.

JANOI DONACIEN - -

Versatile defender who arrived at Stanley on a short term deal on the eve of the 16/17 season starting having been released by Aston Villa. He was born in St Lucia and joined Luton as a youngster before spending time with Tottenham and ultimately Villa and has League Two experience from loans at Tranmere, Wycombe and Newport. After representing his country at under 19 and under 21 level he was handed a senior cap against Trinidad and Tobago in 2006. He signed a new deal in summer of 2017 to keep him at the club until 2019.

LIAM NOLAN

Nolan is a former Northern Ireland Under 21 international joined Stanley from nonleague Southport where he had been playing part-time. The midfielder had previously played in the league with Crewe, after spending two years in their academy and signed a one-year contract with the option of a further year. Has played a role in Accrington's march to the League Two Title this season.

JORDAN CLARK

The attacking midfielder started his career at home town club Barnsley, moving to Shrewsbury in 2014. He scored three goals in his first season as they were promoted from League Two and made 26 appearances for the League One side last season. Joined Stanley in the week leading up to the 2016/17 season after leaving the Greenhous Meadow and signed a new contract in the summer of 2017, keeping him at the club until 2019.

SCOTT BROWN

The experienced midfielder was snapped up by John Coleman following his release by National League side Grimsby Town in the January 2016 transfer window. He'd worked with the Stanley boss before during a spell at Southport that saw him wear the captain's armband. Injuries presented Brown with his first team chance as the season drew to a close and he grasped it, going on to become a pivotal part of the side as the Reds made the League Two play-offs in 2016/17. He has also played an instrumental role in Accrington's success this term.

KAYDEN JACKSON

The speedy frontman, who was once on the books at SN1, signed for Stanley for an undisclosed fee in July 2017 and scored on his debut against Colchester in a 3-1 opening day win. Jackson also scored for Oxford City, Swindon Supermarine and Grimsby during loan spells when making his first appearances for the clubs. The striker has been a key player this term with his sixteen goals helping fire Stanley to the League Two Title.

SEAN MCCONVILLE

McConville, who signed for Stanley originally in 2009, was part of the team who led Stanley to the League Two Play-Off Semi-finals in 2011 and his goals proved vital that season. The wideman subsequently moved onto Stockport, linked up with John Coleman at Rochdale, before joining Barrow in 2012 and spent time with Stalybridge and Chester. Having been player of the season at the Deva Stadium he returned to Stanley in 2015, chalking up regular starts to take him beyond 100 appearances for the club. During 2016/17 season McConville notched 17 assists as Stanley challenged for promotion, he was rewarded with a new contract in the summer keeping him at the club until 2019. McConville has contributed thirteen goals and eleven assists this season to help fire Accrington towards promotion.

BILLY KEE

Northern Ireland striker returned for a second spell with Stanley last season to become a key member of the team. His first taste of league football came with the Reds in a loan spell from Leicester City in 2009, followed by permanent spells with Torquay and Burton Albion that saw him cement a reputation as a dangerous lower league goal scorer. His form brought a move to Scunthorpe but after a frustrating spell there he returned to the Wham Stadium, finding the net 17 times in 2015/16 as he led the Stanley line to great effect. Kee scored 15 times during the 2016/17 season as Stanley pushed for promotion and he leads League Two in scoring this term with 25 goals.

PAUL CRICHTON

Paul's playing career stretched nearly 25 years and encompassed 18 League clubs. Lou Macari signed the then 19-year old on loan from Forest on Christmas Eve 1987 and he made his debut in a win at Reading on Boxing Day, helping Town to ten points in his four games. Paul did not arrive at Accrington until late 2004, when they were in the Conference National. He spent a few weeks back in Swindon as goalkeeping coach in the summer of 2016. STFC 4 apps / ASFC 19

Signed by Sam Alien from Town's Third Division South rivals Aberdare Athletic a week before the 1926/27 season commenced, Percy provided cover at right-back. After he replaced Harry O'Neill following a 9-3 humbling at Brighton, first choice Walk Discourse user declared fits and first choice Wally Dickinson was declared fit and Percy had to sit until April for a further chance. Percy joined anley in July 1927, but only played in the opening to games before losing his place. STFC 3 apps / SFC 2





SID SWINDEN

Following six years at The Hawthorns, during which he had made just four League appearances, Sid came to the County Ground in the summer of 1937. Forging a full-back partnership with Jack Smith, Sid held his place until a knee injury intervened in the November. He returned to the line-up in March following the sale of Smith to Chelsea. Sid left for Peel Park in July 1939, the clubs agreeing a £40 fee - which was never paid due to the onset of War. STFC 37 app / ASFC 21



TONY GRANT

A loan signing from manager Steve McMahon's former club Everton in January 1996, Tony had made his Premier League debut there a year earlier. He netted on his Swindon debut in a 3-0 home win over Hull City, Town also taking maximum points from his other two appearances. Tony joined Accrington in League Two in January 2007 but moved again in the close season to assist his final League club Chester City. STFC 3 apps / ASFC 6



VINCE JACK

A 6'4" centre-half from Ross and Cromarty, Vince was one of Bert Head's first recruits for Town - £1,150 from his former club Bury. The day after signing, in October 1956, he replaced fellow Scot Frank Whyte for a trip to The Dell. But he was consigned to the reserves for the entire 57/58 season when 'Garth' Hudson was ever-present. Vince returned to Lancashire to join Stanley on a free in July 1959, later emigrating to New South Wales: STFC 28 apps /

A BOOT IN BOTH CAMPS



LLOYD JONES

Another big centre-back, Lloyd joined Liverpool from his home town club Plymouth where he had been since the age of ten. After making his League debut while at Cheltenham during a six-week loan in January 2015, he spent the remainder of the season with Accrington. He joined Town on a season-long loan the day before action commenced in August 2016, but a hip injury kept him out for October and he only made the bench after February. STFC 29 apps / ASFC 11



ARTHUR METCALF

Small in stature at 5'5", Arthur played his early football in his native north-east. He joined Liverpool in 1912, netting nearly seventy goals there in 150 games. Town signed him from Stockport in June 1920 but he found the target just seven times during his two years at the County Ground. Arthur's next stop was Stanley where he was top scorer in 1922/23 with 18 goals before he returned to the Third South with Aberdare. STFC 31 apps / ASFC 31

WILLIE MILLAR

A Scot, Willie began his career in his native Ayrshire in 1941 but his first move south of the border was to Swindon in August 1950. In the following March he netted both goals in Town's first ever floodlit game against Bristol City and his name was headline news in February 1952 when he grabbed the winner in an F.A. Cup Fourth Round replay win at Stoke. Willie joined the Gills in 1953 before spending the 1956/57 season at Peel Park. STFC 82 apps / ASFC 26



ACK BURKINSHAW

Signed from Midland League Rotherham Town in early May, Jack made his Swindon debut 108 years ago today - providing Harold Fleming with two 'assists' as his goals won the Dubonnet Cup in Paris. But Jack could manage no more than 19 goals during his three-year stay at the County Ground. By 1921, when he joined his last League club Accrington, he had moved back to wing-half. Today is also the anniversary of his death in 1947, at just 56. STFC 56 apps / ASFC 32



JOE EDDLESTON

After failing to make the grade at Blackburn, Joe - another 5'S" forward - spent five years in the Third Division North, where he hit 100 goals for Nelson. Sam Allen brought him to Swindon in August 1926 to play alongside fellow new boy Hamy Morris, Joe contributing 66 goals to an impressive total of 282 that the pair grabbed up to the end of 1931/32. By then, Joe was 35 and given a free transfer to return to his native Lancashire and Join Stanley. STFC 219 apps / ASFC 41



Oldham-born Jimmy started his career during the Great War and made history in August 1921 when he hit a hat-trickin the first game of Stalybridge Celtic's brief stay in the Football League. He signed for Accrington in 1924, playing in every game that season and netting eight goals. Jimmy arrived at the County Ground in June 1925 as left-wing cover for Bertie Davies but scored just once, in a crushing 8-2 win over Bournemouth in January 1926. STFC 9 apps / ASFC 46

JIMMY THOMPSON



ARNOLD DARCY

(seen here in action for Town in December 1957) began his League career at Accrimaton in March 1952.

He made 40 appearances, scoring nine goals, at Peel Park before joining the then Lancashire League side Wigan Athletic in the summer of 1953. Arnold moved to Swindon in November 1956 and in September 1958 he scored Town's only goal in a 2-1 home defeat by Stanley.

OTHERS WHO SERVED BOTH CLUBS (EXCLUDING CURRENT STAFF):

One hundred years ago, on the 25th March 1918, during the final year of the First World War, footballer Walter Tull was killed in action at the age of just 29.

Before the outbreak of war in 1914, Tull's playing career had seen him make more than 100 senior appearances for Northampton Town, before becoming the first infantry officer of black heritage in the British Army to lead his men into battle. From the football pitch to pitch battle, he made history and was an inspiration to others.

To mark the centenary of Walter Tull's death, the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government and Big Ideas in conjunction with the EFL, Football Association and Premier League's Football Remembers initiative invite schools, football teams and youth, arts and voluntary groups to celebrate his life and achievements through Tull 100 – Football Remembers.
