FOREST GREEN ROVERS INKS DEAL WITH PLAYERLAYER

Following continued broken promises and with no kit delivered almost a month into the club's second season in the English Football League, Forest Green Rovers took the decision to part company with Hummel, its previously announced kit supplier to make the move to the up-and-coming PlayerLayer, based in Nottingham.

ROBERT SANCHEZ

We sat down with Spanish goalkeeper Robert Sanchez as he explains how discrimination impacted his early years in football, making sacrifices to better himself after heading to England to continue his career and how his ambitions don't stop with getting Forest Green promoted during his loan spell from Brighton and Hove Albion. or many, breaking into the professional game is a struggle and a slog of determination and will-power.

For Spanish goalkeeper Robert Sanchez there was the added hurdle of racism that he had to overcome to excel himself to the top.

At a young age, Sanchez came across barriers that would have been confusing and appeared unfair for someone of any age, let alone a child.

However, he was blessed with being smart a trait that also earned him some grief from other children growing up - but he had the awareness to know that if he focussed on himself and working as hard as he could, his ability would soon be more apparent than the colour of his skin.

"Now I realise, if I want to get to where I want to, I have to push myself to the maximum," he said as he sat on the park bench in Stratford Park.

"When I was little, the thing about having different coloured skin made it difficult. Now it is alright but there were some hard times growing up.

"It was also hard because my family didn't have a lot but I worked my hardest and I am what I am now because of my quality.

"Myself, I felt like I was unlucky as I always needed to do much better than the other goalkeepers my age to get recognised and progress.

"Once the coaches saw what I was able to do, and looked beyond the colour of my skin they put me through.

"Before I moved to England I always played in the teams above my actual age and that put me in good stead, playing against bigger players.

"The last years have not been easy, it is never easy trying to make it in professional football, but certainly easier than when I was younger.

"If you make the effort and put in what you want to get out from it, you are going to get it."

Sanchez started his career at La Liga side Levante at the age of 15 and was quickly recognised and started training with the first team.

Having been there for just a year, a childhood ambition to play football in England presented itself when Brighton and Hove Albion came knocking.

While there were other offers on the table for the young keeper, a month spent visiting the West Sussex club and training meant it was an opportunity that he couldn't turn down.

It didn't come without its difficulties though.

"I was only 16," he explained.

"It was quite hard because I was young and I liked to be with my family, so it was hard to move away.

"I also didn't know how to speak any English at all. Not even 'good morning', nothing.

"It was quite hard but I put in the effort to learn English as quickly as I could.



"I quite like new things, so as soon as I had the chance to learn English, I grabbed it. After seven months, I could understand it perfectly and after a year and a half I could start to talk with people.

"I was in digs and I was quite lucky that I was with another Spanish footballer that Brighton had at that time, Luis Garcia, who is playing with Sevilla right now.

"On the football side, it was a different style, it was new faces and a completely different culture - everything was different from what I knew.

"After four or five months, I was quite comfortable living here.

"It's hard but if you want to get to where you want to get to, you have to make these kind of sacrifices."

It was leading into this summer that Sanchez, now 20, sat down with the coaching staff at Brighton to discuss his next move.

Pat Mountain had been keeping close tabs on the up and coming stopper last season and when the approach came from Forest Green to take him on loan for the season to experience first-team football for the first time in his career, it was something he couldn't turn down.

"Forest Green was the best option I had,"

"I came to see the club in the summer and the ground was great, Pat Mountain, the goalkeeping coach, showed a lot of faith in me, and the way the club plays suits me well.

"Since my move, it is exactly what I expected and what my coaches from Brighton have prepared me for.

"It's physical, it's different; the pressure with the people shouting at you, your teammates fighting to win the points, there is nothing you can compare to playing Under 23 football.

"It is a whole new level, it's professional football in the league and it is why everyone wants to play in it.

"The people at the club, the quality of training, is all I expected it to be. It's been top class.

"Forest Green plays differently to other clubs in this league, they play more from the back and I like that, they risk a bit more.

"I feel we have the quality in the team that deserves to at least make the play-offs come the end of the season and that can be the only aim."

FGR fans would have only had a taster of what Sanchez will bring in goal for the team this season.

However, from day one of meeting up

with his new teammates at the training camp in Devon, his class was visible to all as his two metre frame was plucking balls out of the sky or stretching ridiculous lengths to make gravity defying saves.

"I have got a bit of everything," he said when asked to describe his attributes for fans who may not have seen him in action yet.

"I like to deal with everything that comes into the box if I am able to and take the pressure off my defence.

"I like to organise my back four, talk to them and let them know if I am coming or if I'm not and what they need to do.

"I would say shot stopping is another attribute I have along with my distribution.

"Some keepers like to focus on one thing, I like o improve across the board and know there is a lot more for me to learn."

Away from the pitch, you'll find Sanchez doing the same things as many people his age, playing Fortnite on the Playstation, watching the latest films on Netflix or hanging out with his friends.

He also has a shoe collection that would be the envy of many, with some rare Nikes and Adidas sneakers kept box fresh in his wardrobe at home.

"I really like shoes," he added. "I have a large collection at home, a lot of which I don't wear, they are just for my collection.

"I like to finish training, try to recover and then just chill by watching some movies or going for a walk. If my friends are around, I like to catch up with them."

Sanchez has never lost the drive and determination he inherited through adversity at an early age.

As a result, his ambitions don't end with getting Forest Green promoted. He has a clear pathway set out in front of him that he wants to reach the end of.

While he jokes that appearing for Spain at a World Cup could be the ultimate destination, there is a twinkle in his eye as he laughs it off that suggests he won't rest until it becomes a reality.

"Right now I am looking to do well here at Forest Green," he concluded.

"In the years coming I just want to do my best, try to make it in Brighton and who knows from there, the World Cup with Spain would be a dream. Or England, I am only a year away from qualifying for them.

"If you do your best, you can get to where you want."

- BEHIND THE SCENES

It was a very busy summer here working on the new pitch for the start of the season. As soon as I could get on the new surface I did some drainage work behind both goals and then we got the contractors in to assist with putting two drains in the pitch. We then did a lot of work on the secondary drainage to try and prevent the blocking issues we experienced last season as well as adding the sand drainage and seeding the pitch. After that, the heat came and germination became a bit of a problem so we had to put a lot of water on the pitch in order to help the seedlings sprout. The whole top surface came off over the summer and the pitch is now 25mm lower than last season to help open up the drainage pattern underneath in the hope that we won't have any blocking issues like we did last year. The rainwater that falls on the pitch is all recycled as it goes through our drainage system before travelling to the edge of the pitch, down the lino-runs and into the big tank in the corner of the stadium.

WHAT IS IT LIKE WORKING WITH AN ORGANIC PITCH?

It's mainly fed on things like seaweed, sugars, carbohydrates and folic acid. The grass is cut with the solar powered E.T Mo robot and the nets are the only biodegradable nets on the market. The lines are also eco-friendly as they are painted with Ecoline which means that every time I spray them I use 50% less paint. All the weeds on the pitch are handpicked and I go around with a knife and pluck them all out. Every bit of the pitch is a challenge but it's a challenge I love and in my opinion it's the best way to grow a pitch. I wouldn't have it any other way.

GETTING TO KNOW: SWINDON TOWN

It's safe to say that Swindon have not done things the easy way so far this season – in fact, they boast one of the most thrilling, or stressful, openings to the 2018/19 campaign.

It was a summer of change for the Town – eight new players arrived at SN1 fresh for the new season and what a first month it has been.

On the opening day, the Robins were behind twice to League Two new boys Macclesfield Town – but Michael Doughty's hat-trick featuring two penalties in the 96th and 98th minute gave them a last gasp win. Phil Brown has found his team scoring goals but struggling to keep them out – Town are yet to keep a clean sheet this season and have conceded two or more in each of their league games.

Town suffered three defeats on the bounce – Chelsea Under-21s won in the Checkatrade Trophy, Lincoln beat them 4-1 before Rovers overcame them in the Carabao Cup.

Within ten minutes of last week's clash with Tranmere, Swindon were 2-0 down. Tranmere's Jay Harris seeing red tipped the balance in the Robins' favour as the hosts ran out 3-2 winners, while on Tuesday they finished with nine men as they ended up drawing 2-2 away at Crawley Town.

Doughty has caught the headlines this season after signing permanently from Peterborough in the summer. The midfielder, on his third debut for the club, scored a hat-trick while wearing the number 3 – the number his wife had picked for him over the summer. REID SQUEEZE QUORN LOB

Quorn Cumberland Sausage and roasted vegetables

Ingredients

1 pack of Quorn Vegan Cumberland Sausages

 red onion, chopped into wedges
100g butternut squash, peeled and chopped into cubes
red pepper, chopped into cubes
courgette, chopped into disks

2 tbsp oil

1 tbsp dried mixed herbs

1 tbsp smoked paprika

- 1 tsp cayenne pepper
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/2 tsp black pepper



Method

Preheat your oven to 200 C / Fan 180 C / Gas 6. Place the red onion, butternut squash, red pepper and courgette into a roasting tray. Drizzle with 1 tbsp oil and scatter over the mixed herbs, smoked paprika, cayenne pepper, salt and black pepper. Toss until the vegetables are coated in the oil and spices. Place in the oven for 15 minutes.

Meanwhile, place a frying pan on a medium heat. Add the oil and brown off the sausages in the pan for 4-5 minutes, turning frequently.

Add the sausages to the tray of mixed vegetables and transfer back to the oven for 25 minutes, before serving.
